Standard Printed Circuits is dedicated to providing our customers with a quality product fabricated from quality materials. Therefore, SPC is committed to sourcing their materials from vendors who share the same values and concerns.

On August 22, 2012, the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission issued the final conflict minerals rule under Section 1502 the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act also known as the Conflict Minerals Rule. The Conflict Minerals Rule was created to address the exploitation and trade of certain minerals which contribute to violence and human rights abuses in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (the "DRC") and its neighboring countries.

SPC does utilize Gold and Tin in their manufacturing process for their PCBs due to the electrical properties that are essential to proper functioning of PCBs. SPC encourages their suppliers to also uphold the values and expectations of the Conflict Minerals Rule. If SPC becomes aware of one of their suppliers who are not complying and are sourcing materials from a conflict source SPC will take swift action to remedy the situation.

SPC will work closely with their customers in implementing their Conflict Minerals policy so that they may meet their legal obligations and comply with any and all requirements applicable.

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
